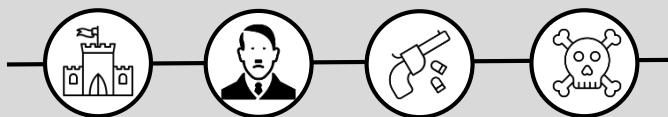


Year 10 GCSE History Mock Examination

What exams will I do?

You will sit Paper 1. This will have two sections.

Paper1	Topics	Time	Date
1 Section A	<i>Germany 1890-1945 Democracy and Dictatorship</i>	1 hour	Thursday 27 th June
1 Section B	<i>Conflict and Tension</i>	1 hour	Thursday 27 th June

Sitting a full paper will allow you to practice the timings and conditions of a GCSE exam and will give us the opportunity to give you a GCSE grade based on this topic.

The paper consists of topics that have been delivered through your History lessons and are a great opportunity to show off what fantastic Historians you are all becoming.

We are giving you this information early so you have plenty of time to plan your revision.

The below revision topics are ones that that could come up in your mock exams.

What topics should I revise?

Section A, Germany

Kristallnacht

- Causes
- Events: what happened during these events?
- Consequence: how were the Jewish community punished?

Impact of WWII

- Rationing, Area Bombing, Refugees, Employment.

Section A, Germany

Knight of the Long Knives

- **Causes:** SA threat the Nazis. **Consequences:** how did Hitler solidify power?

Social Policies:

- **Workers:** increased employment, labour schemes, Rearmament
- **Women:** The three K's, Lebensborn, rise in birth rates, medals and rewards.

Section B, Cold War

Iron Curtain:

- From Allies to Enemies
- Suspicion of West
- Stalin's Reactions

Vietnam War:

- Causes of Vietnam War
- Escalation of conflict
- Changes in conflict under different presidents

Section B, Cold War

• Berlin Blockade and Airlift

- Causes of the blockade and consequences
- China becoming Communist
- Causes of tension around China.
- Treaty of Friendship
- Consequences – NSC 68
